Xiuning Middle School English Library Book Donations

Thank you for your interest in donating a book (or books!) to the English library at Xiuning Middle School. Both the Yale-China Teaching Fellows there and their students are eager for more variety in the library collection. Please consult the information below when making your selection, in order to be certain that your contribution meets the needs of the school.

General Information

First-year student reading levels range from Reading Level Grade 2 up to Reading Level Grade 6, by Scholastic's standards, with the vast majority of students at either RL 2 or 3, less commonly as high as 4. There are some more advanced students, but the English library already has many books that only more advanced students can read.

The vast majority of students do not want to read *Winnie the Pooh* or other books that are obviously for small children. Reading children's stories becomes very patronizing very quickly, and is not engaging.

High Interest, Low Reading Level

The Fellows would like many more RL 2 and 3 young adult books, which are not easy to find, since most RL 2 and 3 books are made for 7- and 8-year-olds. In educational jargon, they are looking for "hi-lo books" (high interest, low reading level). Examples that seem very appropriate:

Picture Books

Picture books are useful if they are short enough to be read in a class period, or if the text is substantial enough to be a worthwhile challenge for lower-level readers. In terms of content, beginner history and biography books are good, especially ones about Western culture, history, and famous people – including NBA stars!

Young Adult Chapter Books

Many books in this category will be inaccessible to a majority of students at Xiuning Middle School due to the relatively high level of English in the books, but it would still be nice to increase the options for those students who want to take on a bit more of a challenge.
